## DEFINITION

1. **Bladder neck stenosis** is a narrowing of the outlet of the bladder resulting in urinary outflow obstruction.

# CLINICAL FEATURES

- 2. The main symptom is difficulty in passing urine which can be overcome by straining.
- 3. As well as outflow obstruction, back pressure effects such as bladder diverticulum, hydronephrosis, or recurrent urinary tract infections and pyelonephritis can result.

## AETIOLOGY

- 4. The condition may be due to -
  - 4.1. **congenital muscular hypertrophy** (Marion's disease or prostatism sans prostate). This form may produce symptoms at any age but usually manifests itself at birth or in early childhood;
  - 4.2. **fibrosis of the tissues of the bladder neck** (an aftermath of chronic prostatitis in men, or urethrotrigonitis in women). This form usually manifests itself after the age of 45 years.

### CONCLUSION

5. **Bladder neck contracture** is a condition of narrowing of the outlet of the bladder which results from muscular hypertrophy or fibrosis.
